

DEUXIEME ETAPE

To express likes, dislikes, and preferences, you'll need to be able to name some things you like and don't like. You'll also need to know how to make a sentence negative and how to use definite articles.

Note de Grammaire Using **ne... pas**

To make a verb like **aimer** negative, put **ne (n')... pas** around the verb.

J'aime la pizza.	→	Je n'aime pas la pizza.
Tu aimes le chocolat?	→	Tu n'aimes pas le chocolat?
Je préfère les escargots.	→	Je ne préfère pas les escargots.

Ne becomes **n'** before a word that begins with a vowel sound.
